Patio Pals is a dedicated team of approximately 20 volunteer gardeners who maintain the garden areas and planted pots surrounding the St. Elizabeth hospice facility on South Loop Drive in Edgewood. Many of the gardeners have had loved ones who benefitted from their own hospice experience and see this work as a way to pay forward.

The gardening work compliments the comradery of the group which is enhanced with two official "workdays", one in the spring and one in the fall. Otherwise, the gardeners work on their own schedules tending to their assigned spaces.
