- Prefer the high dose vaccine, limited quantities are available to volunteers 65+ at Employee Health ONLY.
- Prefer to receive your flu vaccine through your physician/other healthcare clinic or pharmacy, please submit your documentation to the Volunteer Office.
- Require a medical or religious exemption, it is due by November 1.
 Please call your Volunteer Office to obtain the appropriate form.
- Choose to not receive the flu shot, you will be ineligible to volunteer from December 4, 2025 – April 1, 2026.

Respiratory Infection Season Visitor Restrictions

The health and safety of our patients and associates are always the highest priority here at St. Elizabeth. This is especially true during Respiratory Infection Season, when infection spread is more common. To see us through the challenges of this time of year, our annual Respiratory Infection Season Visitor Restrictions at our hospitals will begin

this Wednesday, Nov. 5:

- All persons with respiratory symptoms (cough, runny nose, sore throat, fever, and/or sneezing).
- All children under the age of 14.
- Maternal Child and Infant area restrictions vary.
- Come Wednesday, you will be able to see all updated visitor guidelines at www.stelizabeth.com.

We also ask that associates keep the following best practices in mind:

- Helping patients: Teach patients "cough etiquette" (covering their mouth with tissues or sleeve when coughing), explain proper disposal of tissues, and make hand hygiene product accessible.
- **PPE**: Wear protective eyewear and a mask, or a fluid shield mask with a visor, when caring for patients with respiratory symptoms.
- Wash your hands!: Be vigilant about hand hygiene.
- **Disinfection is key**: Disinfect frequently touched surfaces in the work area such as phones, pagers, keyboards, etc.
- Flu vaccine: Encourage patients and visitors to receive an influenza vaccine.
- **Protecting one another**: Remind patients and visitors that these restrictions are in place to protect our patients from potential exposure to individuals with infections.

Thank you for your vigilance in helping to keep our patients safe, and our teams healthy and whole this season.
