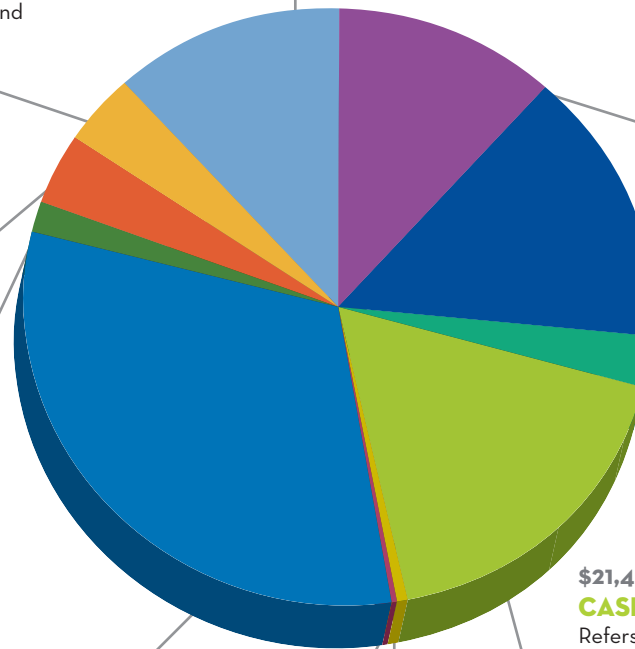
CASH AND IN-KIND CONTRIBUTIONS

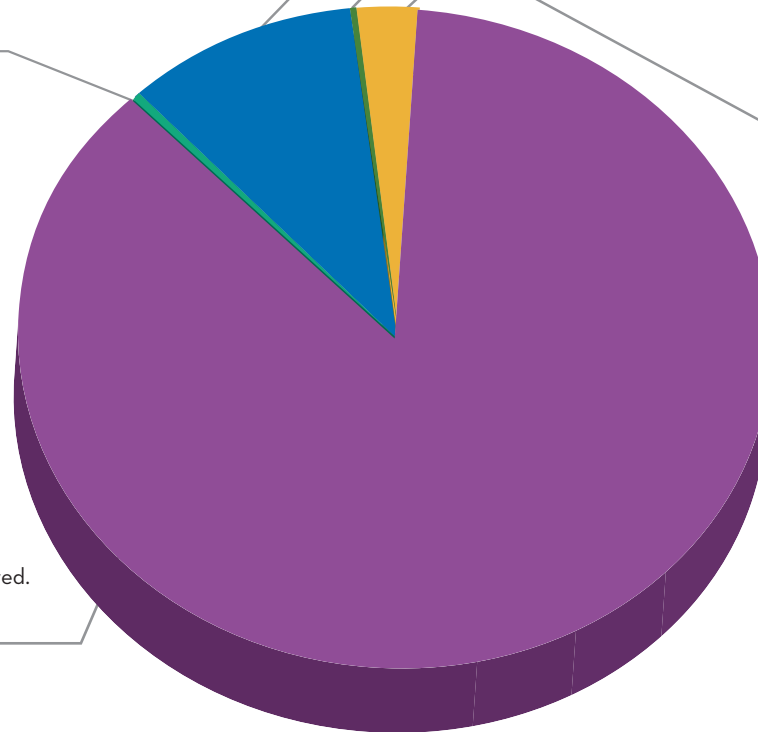
