- The Holbrook Minning Cancer Fund provides approximately \$24,000 in gift cards to support people receiving cancer treatment every year.
- Through the Hospice STARS Program, 125 grieving children and their parents are supported on their journey every year.

INTRODUCING THE ST. ELIZABETH CANCER CENTER



Kentucky has a cancer problem.

Did you know that Kentuckians are diagnosed with cancer and are dying from cancer at the highest rate in the nation? According to the National Cancer Institute, Kentucky ranks first in the U.S. for diagnosis of colorectal and lung cancer, third for kidney cancer, and fourth for oral and cervical cancer. And Kenton, Boone and Campbell counties rank third, fifth and eighth, respectively, for annual cancer diagnoses among counties in the Commonwealth.

But we're focused on finding a solution.

It's time to take cancer care one step further by creating a comprehensive cancer center that will detect cancer sooner and increase survival rates in Northern Kentucky.

"We want to eliminate the devastation of our patients being first diagnosed with stage 3 and stage 4 cancers," said Garren Colvin, President and Chief Executive Officer of St. Elizabeth Healthcare. "Early detection is the key. Until we find a cure, early detection is the single most important strategy to improve survival."

A world-class Cancer Center, this building — and the programs and specialists based within it — will change the trajectory of cancer in our region and transform our community for generations to come.

At five stories and encompassing more than 233,000 square feet, the \$140 million facility will be the largest, most comprehensive cancer center in the Greater Cincinnati region. The Cancer Center will focus on everything from prevention and screening to precision medicine and individually tailored treatment plans, all with the aid of genomics. Our continuum of highly personalized care will save lives and improve the quality of life for survivors in our community — putting Northern Kentucky on the map for innovative cancer care.

Right here at home.

Traditionally, multidisciplinary cancer care has been found only at major academic centers. The St. Elizabeth Cancer Center will change that.

"We don't want people to feel like they have to get on a plane to get the quality of care they deserve," said Dr. Doug Flora, Executive Medical Director of Oncology Services at St. Elizabeth.

Experts including medical oncologists, oncology surgeons, nurse navigators, research nurses, genetic counselors and many others will collaborate to provide cancer detection, diagnosis, treatment and prevention services — all under one roof.

"We also know from research that members of our community are more likely to be screened and access prevention education when it's located close to home," added Dr. Flora.

Together, we'll bring new hope.

At the Center's August groundbreaking ceremony, the St. Elizabeth Foundation announced a comprehensive capital campaign to raise \$30 million in support of the Center. Dan Groneck, Retired U.S. Bank President, and Kristi Nelson, General Counsel and Chief Administrative Officer at Pomeroy, A Getronics Company, will co-chair the campaign.

"You never know when that diagnosis might come to your door," said Mrs. Nelson, a cancer survivor. "One day it was me. The same could be said for every individual in our community. You don't know when you're going to need that resource to sustain your own life or the life of someone you love."

"I love this community, and I want the very best healthcare for each and every one of us," said Mr. Groneck. "The statistics are sobering, but we can change them. We can write a new chapter in the story of cancer's pervasiveness in our region and give our neighbors, our colleagues, our families and ourselves new hope. The results will be lifesaving and will transform our community for generations to come."
