With this partnership, doTERRA will play a foundational role in the development and implementation of integrative care within our new Cancer Center. These integrative care services such as yoga, aromatherapy, acupuncture, music/art therapy, support groups, on-site counseling and demonstration kitchen will help improve the quality of life for our patients and families as they are going through diagnosis, treatment and into survivorship.

doTERRA first learned of St. Elizabeth Cancer Center from one of its very own wellness advocates, Nicole Chase, who was a former patient of Dr. Flora and now a cancer survivor. CARING FOR THE WHOLE PATIENT, UNDER ONE ROOF



As many of us have come to learn, medical treatment is just one aspect — albeit a significant one — of the cancer journey. Managing the physical, mental and emotional aspects of a cancer diagnosis is not easy, and most patients need more than just medical care. In recent years, a growing number of patients have been turning to complementary therapies to augment their conventional treatments.

"Integrative medicine therapies empower patients to take an active role in their healing," said Dwinelva Zackery, Director of Integrative Oncology for St. Elizabeth. "And they aren't just 'feel-good' therapies. Many of them have been proven to reduce side effects, improve symptoms, enhance emotional health and increase overall quality of life. Taking advantage of these services can be essential to the healing process."

When the St. Elizabeth Cancer Center opens next fall, nearly an entire floor of the building (more than 6,000 sq. ft.) will be dedicated to the holistic, patient-centered approach to care known as integrative oncology. Through partnerships with the American Cancer Society and local nonprofit organizations Cancer Family Care and Cancer Support Community, St. Elizabeth will offer a comprehensive suite of therapies and support services — in the very same building where patients will visit their doctor and receive treatment. Services will include acupuncture, yoga, meditation and more, and will be available to patients, as well as family members and caregivers.

"Some of our patients already take advantage of these services elsewhere in the community," explained Zackery. "But for others, the fact that the services are off site has been a barrier. Having the support right here under the same roof as the standard treatments will not only improve accessibility but also help demystify the holistic approach. Why not consider a counseling session during infusion, or try a yoga class while your loved one is in treatment? Our goal is to meet the needs of the whole person and to make it as seamless as possible."

Along with the added convenience comes the opportunity to connect with other patients and caregivers who are navigating the same day-to-day challenges and can identify with what they're going through.

"Oncology is a special field," added Zackery.

"The emotional and social support pieces are so critical to the healing process. I'm truly humbled to be a part of bringing this to our community."

Here is a glimpse at the integrative oncology offerings patients can expect to find when the Center opens next fall:

PATIENT & FAMILY RESOURCE CENTER

American Cancer Society-trained volunteers — many, themselves survivors — will direct visitors to the most up-to-date and relevant information on disease stages, treatment protocols, and clinical trials, as well as resources for promoting physical, emotional, mental and spiritual well-being.

INTEGRATIVE MEDICINE

From massage and acupuncture to aromatherapy and homeopathic medicine, our integrative interventions will help improve the quality of life of patients going through cancer treatments.

ART & MUSIC THERAPY

Creative arts therapies encourage patients to embrace the creative process to express emotions that are often difficult to speak in words. Developing this form of self-expression not only inspires personal growth but also nurtures social interaction, which can enhance healing and relieve anxiety.

MEDITATION

In a quiet corner of the building, patients and caregivers will find a sanctuary to reflect, pray or simply relax before or after treatments or appointments. Staffed with clergy and chaplains experienced in the psychosocial aspects of cancer, it will serve as a source of spiritual and emotional support — or simply a place to pause — for those in need.

MIND-BODY THERAPIES

Regular practice of mind-body exercises is reported to increase flexibility, ease difficulty breathing, offset fatigue, improve sleep quality, reduce stress and enhance mood. Here, our specially trained instructors will create an atmosphere of tranquility, where patients can feel anxiety transform to calm and worry to peace.

COUNSELING & SUPPORT GROUPS

Cancer affects everyone differently.
Our community partners are here to support everyone, from patients to their families and friends, on this journey. Cancer Family Care will offer counseling services, while Cancer Support Community will be hosting a variety of support groups. Here, patients and families will have the opportunity to learn from each other's stories, gaining strength and hope along the way.

DEMONSTRATION KITCHEN

Many cancer treatments can affect a patient's appetite. Therefore, good nutrition can be a vital factor before, during and after treatment. From cooking classes to customized grocery lists, patients and caregivers will benefit from the unique suite of interactive nutrition services offered in our state-of-the-art Demo Kitchen.

OUTREACH & EDUCATION







A GIFT OF GRATITUDE AT YEAR'S END ... THAT CAN BENEFIT YOU AS WELL

Your generous gift has tremendous power. Why? Because generosity heals.

If you are age 70 1/2 or older, you can take advantage of a simple way to make a charitable gift to St. Elizabeth Foundation and receive a tax benefit for yourself at the same time. You can give from your individual retirement account (IRA) directly to St. Elizabeth Foundation, without having to pay federal income tax on the IRA distribution. Also, your IRA charitable rollover distribution counts toward your required minimum distribution for the year.

Federal law allows you to give up to \$100,000 per year from your IRA to a qualified charity. This is especially important to know as you consider the impact of your IRA required minimum distribution on your income tax status.
