Annual Training Due JULY 31

Don't forget to complete your Annual Training requirements. An explanation of these requirements was mailed to you in early June.

Annual Training is being offered online this year, with no in-person training sessions due to the COVID-19 pandemic and guidelines for social distancing. To complete Annual Training, please go to www.stelizabeth.com/currentvolunteers.

In keeping with social distancing precautions, we have decided to **postpone annual TB testing until a later date.**

Additionally, beginning this year, only volunteers in high patient-contact positions will be required to complete an annual TB test. Information on completing this requirement will be sent in a future communication.

What will be different upon return?

- Volunteers, associates and guests are required to wear a mask at all times while at any St. Elizabeth facility.
- Volunteers are required to complete a temperature and symptom screen upon entry to the facility/Volunteer office which will be logged.
- Volunteers who travel outside the country will be asked to delay their return to volunteer at least 14 days after returning home.
- Any volunteer experiencing any symptoms, or a fever, is to remain at home and refrain from volunteering until they are symptom free.
